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Sound Engineer Role Description – 10am service – 2021

We hope to have a team of trained sound engineer volunteers who can volunteer once every 4-6 weeks at the 10am service.

- 1. Arrive 8:30am or whenever the band leader has advised music practice to start from
- 2. Initiate the sound system of which you will receive prior training, this includes
 - a. Turning on the sound desk
 - b. Turning on the amplifiers
 - c. Turn on the wireless microphones as required
 - d. If needed; brief the service participants in how to hold/use the microphone
 - e. If needed; ensure the preacher is aware of the options and is assisted in using the nominated microphone
 - f. Ensuring appropriate mixes are sent to the foldbacks
 - g. Ensuring sound is received from the PC
 - h. Ensuring the sound is appropriate level for the service (also check the cry room feed)
 - i. Ensuring sound is sent to the PC for online services (e.g. zoom, teams, skype etc)
 - j. Switch out old batteries in wireless microphones as required
- 3. Set up/remove the required/unnecessary equipment for the before service music rehearsal
- 4. Store un-used equipment properly
- 5. Record the sermon to the appropriate sound recording device
- 6. Report any breakages or faulty equipment to the relevant member of service
- 7. Monitor the sound during the service and make any adjustments to minimise distraction from focussing on the Worship of God

After the Service:

- 1. Pack down the stage as necessary
 - a. Shut down the Sound desk and all ancillary equipment
 - b. Switch off the amplifiers
 - c. Re set the stage to the basic configuration (ensuring any significant changes you were required to make are as close to original as possible)
- 2. Thank the band and service members for their contributions
